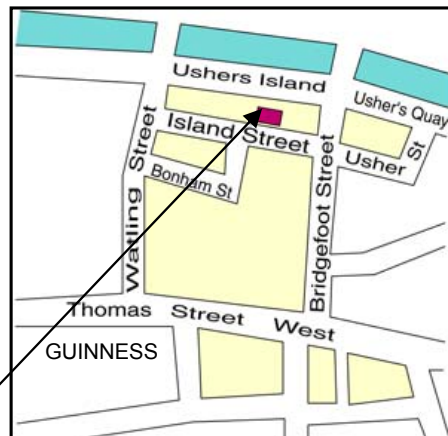

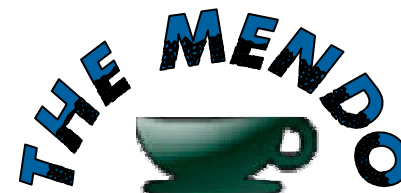

Annual Report

It has been another busy year and we include a table showing the dramatic increase in the number of meals that we have served over the past four years. However we are fortunate in that our three experienced kitchen staff work well together and have coped with the increase.

We have completed the exterior refurbishment of our premises.

We have begun opening on Sunday afternoons serving soup and sandwiches. This is a difficult time for the homeless as there are no other food centres open at that time. We get a large appreciative attendance and run the service using volunteers

We feed a number of destitute East Europeans who have been left stranded by the demise of the Celtic Tiger and who do not qualify for welfare payments. They are reluctant to return home empty handed.

We invited our subscribers to an Open Day in December. Although the weather restricted attendance it provided a good opportunity for board members, staff, community workers, local gardai and public representatives to meet.

Alcohol abuse has led to some aggressive and anti social behaviour in recent times. We are very vigilant as to staff and client safety and we implemented a training course for our staff and volunteers on how to deal with Challenging Behaviour. We also had a Risk Assessment carried out and its recommendations are being implemented.

It is good to report that some of our regulars have been housed. They are still close to the bread line and visit us occasionally.

We continue to provide full meals for the children on the after schools programme run by the Robert Emmett Community Development Project.

We thank you for your continued help as we anticipate another busy year.
